Bush project needs helpers

WITH only four months left, the High Country Urban Biodiversity Project (HCUB) is working hard to get plants in the ground. Organisers are appealing for volunteers to assist with HCUB this weekend: **Picnic and planting in Alma Park, Uralla, tomorrow.** Uralla Shire Council and the HCUB Project are inviting the community to Alma Park from 1pm to 4pm tomorrow. A picnic afternoon tea will be provided before volunteers help plant trees and shrubs along Uralla

Creek. This planting will extend the existing planting below the footbridge, and complement the recent earthworks within the creek. **Bush regeneration at the University of New England, Sunday:** John UNE Landcare and Mary White College from 11am to 1 to remove weeds from the Snow Gum Grassy Woodland below Trevena Rd. Before bush regeneration activities start, Peter Clarke from UNE will talk about the valuable woodland remnant and the

species that are found there. Morning tea will be provided. **Friends of Black Gully planting, Monday:** Work regenerating Black Gully in Armidale will continue with a community planting on Monday afternoon from 4.30pm to 6pm. Volunteers are invited to join HCUB and the Friends of Black Gully group to plant trees and shrubs along the gully behind the New England Regional Art Museum (NERAM).
